Position Descriptions

- Board meetings are held monthly.
- Separate meetings may take place specifically in preparation for events or ongoing projects.
- The President-elect position is a **three year commitment**.
- Convention Chair-Elect, Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect, Student & Chapter Relations Chair-Elect and Editor-Elect each serve **two years**.
- Communications liaison serves a **one year** commitment.

President-Elect (President and Past President)

The President-Elect serves **three years**. In their first year, the President-Elect works closely with the President to determine agenda items while facilitating and overseeing initiatives the SASP board undertakes. The President-Elect:

- Serves as President-Elect in their first year, President in their second year, and Past President in their third year
- Guides the EB in goal-setting and decision-making to actualize activities and initiatives
- Supports EB members in their work through shared leadership
- Collaborates with the Division 16 Executive Committee to advocate for graduate student needs
- Builds capacity for student leadership within the field of school psychology

Communications Liaison

The Communications Liaison serves **one year** and provides communication to SASP members across the nation through the SASP Listserv. They are responsible for maintaining the SASP email and social media. The Communications Liaison:

- Works collaboratively with the EB to ensure all communications are timely, relevant, and accurate for SASP members
- Develops email communications and social media posts to engage SASP members across the nation

Student & Chapter Relations Chair

The Student & Chapter relations chair serves **two years**. In the first year, the S&CR-Elect works closely with the chair to support the needs of school psychology students and SASP Chapter Representatives. They work collaboratively with other board members to host meaningful events for students across the nation and develop resources for SASP chapters.

- Plan and facilitate training and networking opportunities for graduate students based on graduate student interests
- Facilitate conversations between EB members and chapter representatives to ensure meaningful leadership and learning opportunities for graduate students
- Helps new chapters establish and maintain themselves as active SASP chapters
- Requests information from SASP Chapter representatives and disseminates the acquired information to the SASP EB to help the EB make decisions about activities and goals
- Facilitates student interest groups to support student networking opportunities, including the LGBTQ+ Facebook group.

Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect (Diversity Affairs Chair)

The Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect serves **two years**. The Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect works closely with the Diversity Affairs Chair to maintain projects currently underway as well as establish new projects that focus on providing scholarships and networking opportunities for students of color. The Diversity Affairs Chair also works with relevant Division 16 committees to advocate for graduate student needs. The Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect:

- Serves as Diversity Affairs Chair-Elect in their first year and Diversity Affairs Chair Chair in their second year
- Plan for and maintain the Students and Color listserv, which will be established in the Fall of 2020. Make calls and facilitate decision making for the Diversity Scholarship.
- Work collaboratively with the EB to build resources and materials for dissemination to the Students of Color Listserv and SASP members across the nation

Editor-Elect (Editor)

The Editor-Elect serves **two years**. The Editor-Elect works closely with the Editor to produce editorials for The Student Corner, housed in The School Psychologist. The Editor-Elect makes calls for papers and provides opportunities for graduate student writing. The Editor-Elect:

- Serves as Editor-Elect in their first year and Editor in their second year
- Works collaboratively with the Editor and other EB members to provide innovative writing opportunities for graduate students in the field
- Works with the Editor of The School Psychologist to ensure timely and relevant pieces are disseminated in The School Psychologist

Convention Chair-Elect (Convention Chair)

The Convention Chair-Elect serves **two years**. The Convention Chair-Elect works closely with the Convention Chair to plan for student focused events at the annual APA convention. They work closely with Division 16 Executive Committee members planning events for the APA convention to ensure streamlined planning and events. The Convention Chair-Elect:

- Serves as Convention Chair-Elect in their first year and Convention Chair in their second year
- Makes calls for proposals and networks to establish a faculty presenter at the Student Research Forum, an event ran by the Convention Chair and Convention Chair-Elect at the APA convention
