

UNIVERSITY OF SOUTH CAROLINA SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGY POSITION. The Department of Psychology seeks applications for a tenure-track assistant professor position in school psychology to start fall 2016. This position is targeted for a scientist-practitioner whose research and teaching interests align with areas of strength in our department, including but not limited to assessment, child and family interventions, diversity, neuroscience and neurodevelopmental disorders (e.g., autism, ADHD), and school-based mental health. The successful candidate is expected to contribute to the department's mission in conducting grant-funded research, teaching (including undergraduate teaching and graduate supervision of students in fieldwork settings), and service. Eligibility for certification as a school psychologist is expected. The department has three Ph.D. programs (experimental, clinical-community, and school), and collaborative interactions among the faculty are encouraged. The University of South Carolina's main campus is located in the state capital, close to mountains and coast. The Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching has designated the University as one of only 40 public institutions with "very high research activity". Candidates should submit a vita, a letter of application summarizing research interests, teaching interests and philosophy, representative publications, and three letters of recommendation.
