- Reviews and meta-analytic papers that cover emerging issues faced by youth, families, and schools
- Submissions that offer an international perspective
- Author(s) that have not published (very much if at all) previously in *School Psychology Quarterly*
- Authors from underrepresented groups (e.g., early career, women, ethnic minorities and international)

Authors must indicate in their cover letter that their paper should be considered for this call for papers. All submissions will undergo rigorous peer-review.
