Job Description

The Emory Autism Center (EAC) invites applications for a staff position in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences in the Emory University School of Medicine beginning immediately (flexible start date). The outstanding candidate hired for this position will be responsible for providing educational consultation, technical assistance and training to school systems and families supporting the educational and life skills goals of children and young adults with autism spectrum disorder (ASD). Additional roles may include providing social-emotional, vocational and transition assessments for adolescents and young adults with ASD; providing training for community professionals, trainees and families; preparing educational and vocational reports; making referrals to community providers; coordinating projects focused on transition aged youth with ASD; supervising trainees. This position also requires significant auto travel within the state of Georgia and travel to professional conferences and meetings to present research and program evaluation findings.

Qualifications

Appropriate candidates will have obtained their master's degree in psychology, education, counseling, behavior analysis, or other related applied fields. Strong experience in assessment and intervention with individuals with autism spectrum disorder (ASD) is required. Candidates should possess excellent writing ability, outstanding oral communication skills, impeccable organizational skills, and strong interdisciplinary teamwork skills. Applicants with teaching experience (K-12) preferred.
