Need for GPSPI

- Low # of accredited <u>school</u> internships
- <u>University</u> accreditation will soon need to consider student match rates for in their outcomes.
- After 2017 only programs that are accredited by APA or CPA, and have an affiliation with APPIC, will be allowed to send students to the Match.
- In 2014 D16 developed Grant Program for School Psychology Internships (GPSPI)

Goals of GPSPI



- provide funds and consultation for <u>developing</u> <u>new</u> APPIC School Psychology Internship Programs that will eventually obtain APA Accreditation = 5 year time frame
- non-captive programs were preferred
- <u>University- School partnerships</u> to collaboratively develop high quality internships (APPIC, CDSPP and HSP priorities)

GPSPI supports all 3 Phases.

Phase 1

Emphasis on Phase 1-2, where there are fewer additional funding sources.

• Initial internship development

- Securing resources for internship stipends
- Planning for APPIC application and APA self-study

- Apply for APPIC Membership
- Phase 2 Participate in APPIC Match

- Complete APA Self-Study
- Phase 3 Continue toward APA Accreditation

- ✓ identify and secure university **partner**, school district, and other partnerships
- ✓ secure independent **funding** supports
- \checkmark review usefulness of APPIC **forms** for the site

- ✓ outline a **sustainability** plan

The GPSPI will provide consortium **individualized** consultation and mentorship (via telephone and Skype) to grantees in the design and implementation phases of the programming.



GPSPI Interest: Year 1 (2015)

- In 2015 (January), **7** universityschool teams submitted proposals.
 - Potential for 30 to 38 new student internship slots
 - **3** of the 7 were "shovel ready" also received APA/BEA funds:
 - Stephen Austin State University
 - Rutgers SPI Consortium
 - Avondale Elementary School District (U of AZ) Received APA Accreditation !
 - Self Study is posted on D16 site



GPSPI Interest: Year 2 (2016)

- In 2016 (January), 3 university-school teams submitted proposals, 2 received funding (<u>4 internship slots total</u>)
 - Central Michigan University (2 interns)
 - University of North Carolina Chapel Hill Guilford Schools (2 interns)
- In 2016 (June), 5 university-school teams submitted proposals and received funding (<u>20 internship slots total</u>)
 - Pittsburgh Psychology Internship Consortium (P-PIC) (5 interns)
 - Ball State University Internship Consortium (3 interns)
 - Temple University Consortium for Internships School Psychology (TUCISP) (5 interns)
 - North Kansas City Schools (3 interns)
 - Mid-Michigan Psychology Internship Consortium (4 interns)

GPSPI Interest: Year 3 (2017)

- In 2017 (January), 1 university-school team submitted a proposal
- High Plains Psychology Internship Consortium (University of Northern Colorado) (3 interns this Fall) [Rural underserved populations]
 - "Applied for Accreditation on Contingency"
 - Worked very closely with APA in the design
 - Tamara DeHay, PhD APA consultant Clover Education Consulting
- In 2018 (January):
 - High Plains Psychology Internship Consortium <u>already expanded</u> to Nebraska – becoming GPSPI's first multi-state internship consortium!
 - Santa Barbara Psychology Internship Consortium (University of California, Santa Barbara) has 2 interns this year and will have 4 interns in 2018-2019

- Single school district internship training sites too
- Sites serve urban, high poverty schools and communities
- Sites serve culturally and economically diverse communities
- Rural training in multiple states using telehealth supervision exist
- Sites integrate school-based and medical center training

Outcome: Doctoral School Psychology Programs (APA Accredited)

- Currently we have <u>77 APA Accredited School Psychology Programs</u>
 - 60 PhD
 - 8 PsyD
 - 9 Combined Programs {2 clinical-counseling-school; 2 counseling-school; 5 clinical-school}
- In less than 5 years GPSPI Internships are assisting 18 APA Accredited School Psychology Programs - 23%

Other Outcomes

- School Psychology student responses have been tremendous !
 - APAGS
 - D16
 - NASP
- GPSPI recognized by APA governance
 - Complements APA BEA funds "Shovel Ready"
 - APA Monitor articles
 - Leveraging collaboratives

Next Steps

- All GPSPI-funded internship programs should work to obtain APA accreditation
- Addition funding may be secured through the Graduate Psychology Education (GPE) program by HRSA

Application Requirements

Organizations must:

- hold or be in process of holding APPIC member credentials
- hold or be in process of holding APA accreditation (within a five years) be operated by nonprofit entities.
- annually post progress to the Division 16 website
- submit annual reports and budget expenditures to the GPSPI review Committee
- Organizations may apply for <u>up to</u> \$10,000 each
- Applicant should be a member of Division 16
