The Yale Doctoral Internship in Clinical & Community Psychology is now accepting applications in the Fall of 2026 from doctoral candidates in **School Psychology** programs.

School Psychology applicants are welcome to apply to any of our 9 placement sites that fit their training goals. Placement sites which may be of most interest include the West Haven Mental Health Clinic (child and adolescent service, and young adult service), The Consultation Center and the Yale Gender Clinic which serves youth.

Eligibility at time of application:

- Enrolled in an APA or CPA accredited doctoral program in Clinical, Counseling or School Psychology
- Minimum 450 face-to-face hours of assessment & intervention
- At least three years of graduate training
- Passed the comprehensive or qualifying exam

Benefits:

Stipend of at least \$47,074 plus health insurance, vacation, and sick time. A range of additional benefits to support childcare and health & wellness are also available.

Applications can be submitted via APPIC's Application for Psychology Internships (AAPI) portal no later than November 1, 2026.
